We process orders as we get them and they are shipped directly to the customer. It is the top 10% of fruit that is shipped vs. bulk fruit that is used for large shipments like our previous fundraiser. The fruit is individually wrapped and can be shipped to all US states (except Alaska & Hawaii) and Canada. All is 100% guaranteed and replaced if not good. We will be able to take orders for Christmas—not enough time for Thanksgiving shipments. Sales will be held from November through April. The club passed a motion to take on as a new fundraiser. Fruit Sales Committee members are Mike, Roland, and Sarah. Tom reported that our budget is in the black for last year—a thank you to Carolyn for her role in that as President.

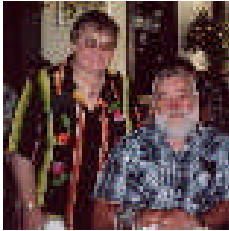

News from Afar: Former member Ed Dawson (& wife Joan) out in the Wild West reports.....



“Many thanks for including me on the Kiwanis Newsletter. I truly miss everyone there. It’s great to hear all the news etc. I also check the News & Sentinel website every week. Really shocked to read of John H’s harrowing experience. I also read his column in the Sunday News.

We finally moved into our new house 8/15. We have been on the go ever since. I think we have actually lived in the house less than 3 weeks since then. We left 9/18 & returned yesterday. This was our annual Fall Dixieland Jazz trip. Instead of traveling about 8000-9000 miles we only traveled 2000. We started by visiting our daughter in Everson, WA (near the Canadian border) & then crossed the border to Vancouver, BC for our first festival. Then a very pleasant & scenic drive across southern BC through the Canadian Rockies to Kalispell, MT. Another scenic area. Brad Brooks has a son near there in Columbia Fall I believe. We then drove down to Missoula, MT to spend a week waiting for friends to continue on to Sun Valley, ID. We got to see our first snow of the season. The drive from Missoula to Sun Valley is spectacular. Two mountain passes, Lost Trail at 7200’ & Galena at 8700’ had snow on the ground but the roadway was clear. As usual we saw elk & big horn sheep along the way. This route takes you through Stanley, ID in the Sawtooth Mountain recreation area. Prime snowmobile country. I would like to try it some time. Sun Valley is a great place & the festival is top notch. Needless to say it is big buck country when the snow is on the ground. We heard that the new condos being built start at \$1.5M. As I said we arrived home yesterday after a pleasant 1-1/2 days drive. We leave again next Monday for our last festival of the year in Ocean Shores, WA. Then it’s getting busy unpacking etc. No more festivals until late January. In the mean time we belong to 2 local jazz clubs that have jam sessions once a month.

I’m finally able to scratch a life long itch & am learning to play my tuba & trombone with the goal of joining the Albany, OR community band & participate in the Dixieland Jam sessions. Believe me; I have a long way to go.

We have a possible deal pending on the house. Nothing on the new garage or the other 5.75 acre piece. Thanks again for including me in all of the Colebrook news. Give our regards to everyone.”
